

Golf Course Local Rules

Royal & ancient rules will govern all play.

Stake Markings

Water hazards are defined by yellow stakes. Lateral water hazards are defined by red stakes. Environmentally sensitive areas are defined by blue stakes. Ground under repair are defined by white and green stakes. Drop zones are defined with white lines.

Out Of Bounds

The boundaries of the golf course are marked with white posts. A ball lying beyond the boundary line is deemed to be out of bounds.

Distance Markers

All fairway distance markers on the golf course are measured in metres to the centre of the greens.

Environmentally Sensitive Areas

Environmentally sensitive areas are defined with blue stakes on hole no. 10 and hole no. 18.

A player losing a ball in these areas should under penalty of one shot proceed to the designated drop zone at the front of the greens marked with white lines.

Ruins on hole 6 are deemed immovable obstructions with relief being taken accordingly.

Players may ground their clubs without penalty in the natural, unmaintained waste bunker areas.

Immovable obstructions are defined as all cart paths, golf course furniture, fairway distance markers, sprinkler heads and irrigation control boxes. Relief should be taken under (Rule 24-2).

Players must repair pitchmarks, replace divots, and rake bunkers.

Dress code rules must be adhered to.

Loose stones may be removed from bunkers.
